
Part Two: Concepts and Principles of Popular Education

- Everyone Teaches; Everyone Learns
- The starting point is the concrete experience of the Learner
- Involves a high level of participation
- Is a collective effort
- Leads to action for change
- Stresses the creation of new knowledge
- Links local experiences to historical and global processes

Questions to ask in Reflection:


- Describe what you saw

- What can we do? (Action)




Popular Education Tools




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






MEN'S MAP OF THEIR VILLAGE AND PROPOSED CHANGES GRULON, SIGNAL LEONE
