
GROWTH

- Almost 70% of all employees are female
- About 60% are non-white and Latinos are the largest plurality of any race (43%).
- This illustrates a more diverse workforce as compared with all employed people in the country's labor force.


- Worker ownership has created both economic value and low inequality within firms.
- The median respondent distributed an additional \$32,000 to their workers in 2015, roughly translating to over \$2/ hour additional compensation for the typical worker
- 2-to-1 ratio between the highest and lowest paid workers and none reporting higher than a 12-to-1 ratio.


Initiations by employee demographic - Women



Initiations by employee demographic - Low Income




Initiations by employee demographic - Racial or Ethnic
