- ✔ Wanted collegial, flat, democratic organization








- Most work in own business + Flourish
- Volume of work has been significant this fall
- A substantial amount of volunteer time is involved
- A certain amount of turnover


#### ADDRESSING THE CHALLENGE

- Commitment and sense of value
- Cut people some slack; kept up most meetings
- ✓ Share + reframe as investment
- Accommodate and leave room for re-entry. Plan for expansion



### **Embracing Opportunities**


- <u>Seek:</u> clients wanting to tackle success issues
