Starting her career in 2005, as a commercial lender, Daphane learned the most conservative approach to business analysis. Through questioning management practices and robust financial analysis, risk was strictly managed which was challenging for business owners during the 2008 economic crisis. It struck her that not everyone had the same opportunity for success, and as a volunteer on the Community Futures loan committee, Daphane learned that Community Futures seek to equalize imbalance.

She found social impact lending to be a pleasant experience, incorporating a client's character and history within a community and illuminating the human side to businesses lending. This application of financial analysis led her to seek opportunities with other purpose-driven organizations to provide much needed balance to her work-life.

Over the seven years a director with Interior Savings Credit Union (ISCU) Daphane achieved designations as an accredited Credit Union Director and a Governance Professional of Canada, attesting to her notable experience with board governance as well as her commitment to lifelong learning. During the onboarding process with ISCU in 2016, Ms. Nelson became enthralled by the cooperative model and has been amassing a knowledge base on the topic since then. She embarked upon the online two-year Advanced Cooperative Development course through CoopZone Developer's Network Cooperative, from which she graduated in June 2020, and is now the secretary and governance chair for that board.
