

Julia Fursova (She/They), School of Leadership Studies, UNB, is an academic partner, codirector, and co-founder with <u>Transform Practice</u>, a consulting worker co-op offering services in participatory research and evaluation, community engagement and supporting systems change.

Julia is a community-engaged scholar whose research program has been influenced by lived experience, grassroots priorities, continuous dialogue with community members and a commitment to decolonization in research and action. Julia's areas of expertise include

diversity, equity, and inclusion in leadership; participatory research and participatory developmental evaluation; facilitation; intersectional feminist analysis; knowledge mobilization.

Since 2023 Julia has been collaborating with the CWCF on advancing its justice, equity, diversity, decolonization and inclusion efforts in the Canadian worker co-op movement. In January 2025 this collaboration resulted in a federally funded project (SSHRC PEG grant) for a community-led research "Calling in and calling out – supporting justice, equity, diversity, decolonization, and inclusion (JEDDI) transformation in the Canadian worker co-op movement." The project invites and builds on contributions of the co-op leaders from equity-denied groups and explores what can be done differently within the Canadian worker co-op movement to disrupt the reproduction of whiteness and patriarchy. In addition, to their work with the CWCF, Julia is collaborating with women and non-binary-led social enterprises in New Brunswick and broader Atlantic Canada to enhance services and supports for local co-ops and social enterprises in the region.
